



Code of Ethics for IMUNE International Qualifications

The following code of ethics is implicitly accepted by applicants to ensure a high level of integrity and professional conduct.

An Internationally Licensed professional will conform to the following as a minimum code:

1. Respect all clients independent of presentation, origin, status or desires.
2. Follow the principle of "First do no harm"
3. To fully inform the clients as to the nature, potential benefits and limitations/restrictions of your services.
4. Interact with all clients and colleagues with honesty, integrity, openly and ethically mindful that each individual is unique and has unique needs.
5. To employ active listening to clients and offer educational information, not to portray information as fact but provide information to enable as far as practicably possible the client to make informed choices.
6. Not to misrepresent information as fact that is possibilities only.
7. To operate within the legalities applying in the country of practise and in particular not to represent any authority in respect of diagnosis or treatment etc. unless specifically authorised under additional statutory/ regulatory authorities empowered by the law of the country.
8. To ensure interactions appropriate to client's objectives and needs, always operating in the client's interest, including referral to and/or suggestion of other health professional services.
9. To present qualifications, expertise and experience accurately and not to infer and competence or authority that is inaccurate.
10. To fully and accurately inform the client in all possible respects.
11. To offer and implement confidentiality, including any legal data protection requirements except as may be a legal disclosure requirement.
12. To establish supportive links to access additional expertise or knowledge.
13. To maintain appropriate records.
14. To engage with other professionals and professional organisations with respect and high ethical standards.
15. In case of disagreement or dispute, or knowledge of rumour or disparagement to employ the relevant advise and complaint procedures, including colleagues, organisations, manufacturers and suppliers.
16. To actively pursue skill development.
17. To support and promote Natural Medicine.
